## Foreword from the Principal

Panihati Mahavidyalay is a co-educational academic institution situated on Barasat Road, Kolkata 700110. The college is located in the vicinity of Panihati Municipality and Barrackpore Trunk Road. It is well connected to Kolkata and the North 24 Parganas by bus and rail routes. The humble beginnings of the college go back to the year 1974, when Panihati Municipality generously made a donation of one acre of land for establishing a degree college. The foundation stones were laid by the then chief minister, Siddhartha Sankar Roy, on 3rd February, 1974, with a view to open a gateway of higher education for local boys and girls. Sri Tapan Chattopadhyay was the first Founder-Secretary of the institution. The origins of the institution were truly modest. Initially, classes were held inside makeshift classrooms of a building that was still being constructed. Benches and desks were often borrowed from nearby schools during the time of examinations.

Panihati Mahavidyalaya became affiliated with the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education in July, 1976. Teachers from local schools and university postgraduates offered their benevolent service to teach in the Higher Secondary Section. In 1978, the institution was granted affiliation by the University of Calcutta for offering degree courses in B.A. (General) and B.Com. (General) alongside the existing Higher Secondary section, in the following subjects: English, Bengali, Political Science, History, Economics, Philosophy and Mathematics. It was conferred the status of a degree college by the West Bengal Higher Education Department on 1st July, 1990 (w.e.f. 1st July, 1989), thereby becoming a Government-aided college recognized under sections 2 (f) and 12 (b) of the UGC Act 1956. Consequently, all existing full-time and part-time teaching and non-teaching staff of the institution were brought under the pay-packet scheme of the Government of West Bengal. The institution, which is now affiliated with the West Bengal State University, offers several Honours and General courses in the Arts, Science and Commerce streams. There are 15 Honours subjects and 20 General subjects.

Several developments have come about in recent times. With financial aid from MLA LAD and MP LAD funds, Panihati Mahavidyalaya has built, in the past few years, a seminar hall with digital facilities and a high-end virtual smart classroom. A WiFi facility with high-speed internet is also available. The Central Library of the college has been upgraded and is now managed through the open-source Integrated Library System, Koha. Library space has been increased with the addition of an adjacent room. CCTV cameras have been installed inside the campus for surveillance and as a security measure. Solar inverter is available for harnessing solar power and for providing electric backup. Lift has been installed in the Science Building. Water purifiers are installed at several places of the college for use by students and staff.

The major sources of institutional funding are grant from the Government of West Bengal, UGC grant, and student fees. The college also receives occasional grants from MP and MLA funds. The college has been effectively dispensing various scholarships provided from the Chief Minister Relief Fund to financially poor students and SC/ST/OBC minorities. One Concession on tuition fees is provided to needy students. The college ensures that female students benefit from the 'Kanyashree Prakalpa' which seeks to improve the status and well-being of girls, specifically those from socio-economically disadvantaged families.

A combination of traditional and contemporary pedagogical approaches towards education is the hallmark of this institution. The traditional classroom-lecture pattern is supplemented with the use of the latest technologies. This includes the regular use of PowerPoint presentations,

screening of relevant films and documentaries, and the occasional arrangement of video-lectures and video-conferences in the virtual classroom. The teaching-learning process is made interactive through coordination of debates, extempore speeches, academic presentations, quiz, etc. This facilitates greater understanding and provides a participatory space for students.

In a world dominated by virtuality and visual simulation, in order to make teaching more apposite and contemporaneous, digital technology is unavoidable. Keeping itself updated about the latest available technologies, Panihati Mahavidyalaya also ensures that the process of learning is grounded firmly in the reality of everyday life, and that it produces knowledge that is useful and practical. To this end, educational tours and excursions are arranged from time to time. The whole idea behind these endeavours is to promote originality of thinking in the students and provide them with necessary guidance.

The professional, as well as the ethical considerations, are held important by our institution. Students are prepared in such a way that they can face and overcome challenges when they enter professional and academic fields, after completing graduation: they are equipped with practical knowledge of the subjects they have studied. Many students from our institution enroll at the Master's level at universities after they graduate. Many of our students go on to prosper in their respective fields, securing jobs at the levels of both government service and the private sector. Although our institution is primarily dedicated to promoting the cause of education, it values and nurtures talents in the students, through the regular organization of different cultural programmes and sports-related activities. With the upcoming Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), there will be major structural changes in the curricula and their implementation. The faculty members and the staff are ready to ensure a smooth and effective implementation of the new system.



The college has a Governing Body, Teachers' Council, Academic Committee, IQAC Team and other subcommittees. All these bodies are supportive of the smooth functioning of the college. The college has a research committee for monitoring and encouraging teachers for pursuing research. Besides the minor project from the UGC, there are major research projects with different sources of funding, such the ones undertaken by the Department of Zoology.

Various programmes are organized by NSS unit from time to time, such as organising blood donation camps, health check-ups, Womens' Day celebration, preventive awareness programmes, tree-plantation programmes, community outreach activities, etc. Cultural programmes involving the participation of students and staff are occasionally held. The college has made a MOU with the National Skill Development Corporation regarding skill development training in Modern Office Management, IT Help Desk Assistant, Domestic Data Entry Operator, Field technician, Certificate in A.C Servicing, Beautification and Makeup Artist Professional Courses.

I would like to acknowledge the contribution and dedicated efforts of individuals from all walks of life and faculty members, all office staff and students who deserve full credit for these numerous achievements and developments. I extend my heartiest gratitude to all who have been extending their support constantly to the institution. Moral education means development of right emotion, character and actual values, and formation of good habits covering all aspects of one's personality – moral, physical, social and mental.



## Important Academic Rule

### NOTICE BOARD

Each & every student must consult the '**General notice board**' & also the '**Departmental notice board**' regularly. The college will not to be held responsible under any circumstances, in case the student fails to do so.

Students should also provide correct mobile numbers to the college office so that they get important notifications through SMS from the college.

### ATTENDANCE

75% of total attendance -: the candidate is '**collegiate**' & allowed to sit in the final examination.

In between 60-75% of total attendance -: the candidate is '**non-collegiate**' & will be allowed to sit in the final examination '**if & only if**' he/she pay the required fine as condonation of '**short percentage**'.

Less than 60% -: the candidate is '**dis-collegiate**' & will be debarred from sitting in the final examination.

### COMMENCEMENT OF SEMESTER CLASSES & CLASS HOURS

First semester classes for b.a./b.com/b.sc. (hons. & gen.) Courses (2023-24) shall commence in accordance to the wbsu academic calendar. However, other semester classes will start within 7 days from the date of completion of the previous semester examinations.

### COLLEGE EXAMINATIONS & RESULTS

As per CBCS guidelines it has become mandatory for all hons. & gen. Students that they be academically assessed in each theoretical paper through internal examinations arranged by the college.

All concerned students of general practical classes shall be assessed for 80 marks through their academic performances in internal practical classes.

### PAYMENT OF FEES

Payment of monthly tuition & other fees has to be paid within 15<sup>th</sup> of each current month. Otherwise, a late fine of ₹ 1/- per day will be levied & collected with subsequent dues in the next calendar month.

### PARENT-TEACHER MEETING

Regular parent-teacher (legal guardian in exceptional cases) meetings are held to discuss about a candidate's progression in academic field along with their attendance issues (if any).

The HOI/Departmental teachers appraise the parent/guardian about their wards' irregularity /poor performance & the relevant consequences the candidates may face if they do not rectify themselves.

### TRANSFER/WITHDRAWAL CERTIFICATE

A student may apply to the hoi for transfer/withdrawal certificate in his/her favour at least a week before the date of issue. Application for the certificate must be signed both by the student & his/her parent/legal guardian.

Students seeking transfer/withdrawal certificate during mid-session must pay all charges up to the current month including transfer fee of ₹1000. They must also obtain a clearance certificate from the head librarian & from the concerned departments.

### IDENTITY CARD

A student is required to obtain an identity card duly signed by the hoi & will be issued before commencement of the class of the 1<sup>st</sup> year. Bearing identity card is a mandatory in the college premises & is essential to be produced at the office along with the fee book for issuance of library card, railway/bus concession clearance certificate etc.

## Rules for General Conduct & Discipline

A student is obligated by admission to the college to observe college rules and all directives issued by the concerned College Authority. In insurance to this context, alertness has been directed towards the Rules & Discipline of the college. In order to keep themselves updated, students are advised, to follow the college 'Notice Board & Website' on regular basis.

- All students are answerable to the Head of the Institution (HOI) for their conduct in college.
- The College Authority reserves the right to cancel the admission of any candidate based on provision of incorrect information.
- Students must be respectful to all teaching and non-teaching staffs, librarian and to each other. Any form of physical or mental ill-treatment based on ethnicity, gender and class will be strictly dealt with.
- 'Right of Admission' is being reserved for the HOI's room, the Staff room, the Office and the Bursar's room.
- Wearing of identity card is a must for every student during the college hours.
- Students must cooperate with the College Authorities in maintaining overall hygiene of the college compound. In this context, smoking, spitting, chewing betel leaves, consumption of alcohol or other tobacco-based products and taking any form of drugs are completely forbidden within the college premises.
- Wastage of electricity and drinking water must be avoided.
- Cycling and riding of vehicles is not permissible within the college campus.
- Loitering in the corridor/examination hall during class/examination hours will be treated as grave offence. In the free hours, students may go to the library/common room.
- Playing of outdoor games within the college compound during class hours are not permissible.
- Mobile phones must be 'switched off' in the classroom/library and are strictly prohibited in the examination hall.
- Without prior permission from HOI, any sort of gathering within the college premises, under any pretext, will be declared illegal and may be subjected to jurisdiction of local police station.
- Destruction and defacing of college properties will be subjected to severe form of punishment.
- RAGGING in any form is strictly prohibited. The 'ANTI RAGGING CELL' formed by the College Authority stands for the prevention of ragging in the college campus. Any attempt of ragging will be severely dealt with leading to expulsion from the college.
- In case of repeated violation of code of disciplines, particularly those mentioned above, a student will be liable to harsh disciplinary actions such as expulsion from the college or handing over to law personnels whichever the College Authority finds suitable.





### Library Rules

- **Lending Period:** 7 Days (Two books at a time)
- **Loss/Damage of library books:** Users need to must replace a copy of the book (latest edition).
- **Loss of library card:** Student has to pay Rs 10/- as fine.
- **Library Fine:** After the due date of submission Rs. 50 paise per day need to be paid as a fine amount.



## Other Rules

- Students must return all books before form fill up for the University examination and get the no due certificate from the Central Library.

- Chatting or sitting idle inside the library, talking over phone or sleeping is strictly prohibited.
- Any misbehavior inside the Library may lead to cancellation of Library membership.



#### College Common Room




